"When do I need a building permit"

A building permit shall be required for any work which must conform to the Uniform Building Code.

The application for a building permit shall include locations of all buildings, whether existing or proposed, and indicate all setbacks dimensions from property lines. Give tax map number also.

Provide a description of the project construction to include, but not limited to: nature of work, mechanical, electrical and plumbing installation. Plans: set of drawings or blueprints are required. Stamped plans are required for all commercial projects, Single family homes that exceed 1500 Square feet, foundations that do not have a footing that is below the frost depth of 4 feet and brand new septic system.

Exceptions to the requirement for building permits may be allowed for:

- 1. Necessary repairs which do not materially affect that structure feature.
- 2. Alterations to an existing building, provided that the alterations:
  - a. Do not materially affect structure features
  - b. Do not affect a safety feature
  - c. Do not involve the installation or extension of electrical systems
  - d. Do not include the installation of solid fuel burning heating appliances and associated chimneys and flues

Do I need a permit for replacing windows and doors?No
Do I need a permit to put in a driveway?No
Do I need a permit for a septic system?Yes
Do I need a permit to install a heating system?Maybe
If it is gas heating systemNo
If it is a wood heating systemYes
If it is an pellet/corn heating systemYes

If it is an electric heating system.....Yes

Snow weight load for a roof is 60 pounds per foot

Anything that is 144 square feet or larger needs a permit
