SUPERVISORS REPORT: 05/16/2023

- Financial Report
- -Details of all income and expense transactions have been filed with the town clerk.
- -Account balances as of May 16, 2023, for the general fund, highway fund, capital improvement fund, and street light fund have been filed with the town clerk.
- -The fence and backstop work are coming along good. We will need a few yards of topsoil to fill the gaps under the backstops. I will be getting some more supplies this week to finish the top rail. I would like to get the fields rolled as soon as the roller is freed up, but they are looking good. We will get the concrete poured as soon as Andy Wood gets freed up.

Richard stated they can do some fill for backstops when they are hauling fill for the parking lot up by old school. He also stated the men could roll the field.

LEGISLATURE REPORT: Larry Denesha

- The Highway Outposts are done we bonded for 1 and paid for 2.
- ARPA Funds: we allocated 2million900 thousand to the IDA for facility structure, CEO training, Childcare training, and tourism. We have spent 1million754thousand so far.

- He discussed the Enhanced Federal Advance Program: It started out that
 the money would go to the counties and NYS intercepted the funds/ 1.6
 billion that counties should get. The State passed in the budget to take the
 funds over in 3-4 years in 2027 the state will keep all the money. The
 county will have to raise taxes 6% to cover the cost. There are 60% of
 NYS are eligible for Medicaid.
- After 3 years of unpaid taxes, they become delinquent and will foreclose.
 Last year we took \$100,000 over the back taxes that were owed on the
 property. There is legislature in that will make it so the money taken in
 over the amount of taxes owed will be given to the landowner. It is headed
 for the Supreme Court now.
- DMV: the new state budget will give the counties 10.5% of the money now whereas, the county was getting 12.5%.
- On a good note, the sales tax was up.

Highway Superintendent Report: 05/16/2023 * Richard Meilleur

We have spent the majority of our time getting ready for our paving projects. We have opened up the Belleville Road to let more sun in. We removed all the large trees and brush and cleared the whole road back to the right-a-way.

We have cut, split and stacked 50 cords of firewood from the trees we removed off the Belleville Road.

We are also ditching and cutting shoulders on the Smith Road and Lazy River Road from CR 25 all the way to the Hermon town line.

We have stockpiled 738 tons of crushed stone from Barrett's to use on our dirt roads; we will be putting it on after we finish prepping for the paving projects.

As of today, we have 1 truck broke down and we are having a hard time getting the wiring harness we need to fix it also our chipper is down with a blown engine; we are trying to get a price on a complete engine and a price on a rebuild kit.

I would also like to thank the men for another safe and productive year. The new truck should be here in August or September.

The cost to fix the chipper could be around \$15,000. Some parts are 3 months out getting them.

If it cost too much to fix the International that is broke down we will put it on Auction International with the small mower and a few other things.

Shane Mackin would like to take his vacation week the 1st week of July.

Superintendent Meilleur went over the CHIP's paving projects 2023 (CHIP's, EWR, PAVENY, POP) with the board:

- 1. Smith Road: From CR 25 1.2 miles west to the West Road 1" shim + 1.5" top x 18' wide. Type 6 hot mix 1850 tons at \$63.04/ton=\$116,624.00. SLC paving 1.5 days @ \$5,800/day = \$8,700.00. 5/8 gravel 350 yards @ \$10.50 yard = \$3,150.00 for a total of \$128,474.00.
- 2. Lazy River Road: From Hermon Town Line 1.45 miles East shim remaining sections .8 miles 1" shim 1.45 miles 1.5" Top x 18' wide. Type 6 Hot Mix 1740 tons @ \$63.04/ton = \$109,689.60. SLC paving 2 days @ \$5,800.00/day = \$11,600.00. 5/8 Gravel 350 yards @ \$10.50/yard \$3,675.00 = \$124,964.60
- 3. Belleville Road: From Fordham Hill Road 1.85 miles South 1" shim 1.45 miles 1.5" Top x 18' wide Type 6 Hot Mix 2750 tons @ \$63.04/ton = \$173,360.00. SLC paving 2.5 days @ \$5,800.00/day = \$14,500.00. 5/8 gravel 400 yards @ \$10.50/yard = \$4,200.00 =\$192,060.00.
- 4. Pestle Street: From CR 24 to .16 miles West (to Mill Street) 1.5" Top (Type 7). Type 7 Hot mix 200 ton @ \$66.00/ton = \$13,200.00. SLC paving 1 day @ \$5,800.00/day = \$5,800.00 = \$19,000.00.
- 5. Silver Hill Road: From CR 17 .85 miles South (to Cook Road) crushed limestone 3" deep x 18' wide. 5/8 crushed stone 1048 tons @ \$10.50/ton = \$11,004.00.

- 6. Cook Road: From Silver Hill Road .85 miles Southwest to bus turnaround crushed limestone 3" deep x 18" wide 5/8 crushed stone 1048 ton @ \$10.50/ton = \$11,004.00
- 7. Mackin Road: From CR 17 .4 miles North crushed limestone 3" deep x 16' wide 5/8 crushed stone 438 ton @ \$10.50/ton = \$4,599.00.
- 8. Nolan Road: From CR 17 .7 miles East crushed limestone 3"deep x 16" wide 5/8 crushed stone 770 ton @ \$10.50/ton = \$8,085.00.
- 4.66 miles total paving projects \$464,498.60
- 2.8 miles total crushed stone on dirt roads \$34,692.00

Total 7.46 miles overall total \$499,190.60 that leaves \$4,579.10 as a buffer-rollover.

Other paving projects (NOT CHIPS)

- 1. RVFD 46"x88' x 1.5" = 38-ton Type 7 Hot Mix @ \$66.00/ton = \$2,508.00
- 2. Courthouse: 50' x 85' x 1.5" 40-ton Type 7 Hot Mix @ \$66.00 = \$2,640.00
- 3. Town Hall: 85-ton Type 7 Hot Mix @ \$66.00 = \$5,600.00

These are paving projects that the board can agree on to be done to tie all the 3 buildings in. Supervisor White did not think the back of Town Hall Needed to be done, just from corner by post office to Pestle Street Road.
