Local Law No. 1 of the year 2023

A local law <u>Pertaining to Parking on Town Roads</u> Be it enacted by the <u>Town Board</u> of the Town of Russell as follows:

Article 1. Authority. The Town Board of the Town of Russell, pursuant to the authority granted under Vehicle and Traffic Law and Sections 10 and 20 of the Municipal Home Rule, Law of the State of New York, hereby enacts as follows:

<u>Article 2. Statement of Purpose and Findings.</u> The Town Board of the Town of Russell has reviewed its current parking situation and finds that enacting parking regulations for Town Roads is in order. It is the purpose of this local law to define certain no parking areas within the Town of Russell.

Article 3. Enactment. The Town Board of the Town of Russell hereby enacts the following:

- A. No person shall park a motor vehicle at any time on Town roads adjacent to any guide rails, with the exception of construction vehicles involved in highway maintenance or repair; emergency vehicles; or temporarily inoperable vehicles experiencing mechanical failure, which vehicles shall be removed as quickly as possible, but in no event longer than a 24-hour period.
- B. Vehicles parked on Town roads in violation of this law will be towed away at the owner's expense and the vehicle owner shall be subject to a fine of no less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)

Effective Date: This Local Law shall be effective upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.

Morris Jeffries asked why the board thought the law was needed. Supervisor White stated that with the roads being 18 foot wide and someone pulls over by a guide rail to answer phone etc. it does not leave much room to go around and can cause a hazardous situation.

Tina Dafoe asked if people could park on either end of guide rails? Answer was yes if not along the guide rails.

He is an ancestor who owned and ran a Grist Mill on the Grasse River. He was also Supervisor in 1871 for Russell. He also had other businesses he ran in Russell. The Town stated that the sign would have to go by roadside because there is a ball field in front of the cemetery.

- We passed a resolution recognizing 14 farms in SLC that have been in operation for 100 years.

Highway Superintendent Report: 06/20/2023 * Richard Meilleur

We have cut shoulders on 10 miles of our roads. We cut shoulders on Backus and Forbes roads and added crushed stone where needed.

We cut back brush and added some gravel on the Webb Road, we cut shoulders on Pestle Street.

We are almost done mowing the roadsides and cleaning up along all the roadsides.

We have sent our chipper engine to Stickney's to be rebuilt.

The Mack that we have been waiting for parts for is fixed and back in service.

We installed 2 signs on Blanchard Hill Road (speed zone signs) and 2 congested area signs on Lake George Road.

We have started cutting shoulders on Silver Hill Road and will be adding crushed stone after the shoulder work is done.

We have also been working on Belleville Road to finish up slopes and getting it ready for paving.

Vac truck will be here Thursday for the pump house.

I would like to put our 1996 International Patch Truck and the Craftsman lawn mower on Auctions International.

Greg Given also has a few things he wants to put on for the Fire Department.

I would also like to thank the men for another safe and productive month.

Paving is going slow we expect August to do ours.

- 7. On a road commencing at Silver Hill Road(Cook Road) and leading to Southwest a distance OF .85 miles there shall be expended not over the sum of \$13,790.00 Type Crushed Stone Width 22" Thickness 6".

WHEREAS, the Agency's Uniform Tax Exemption Policy ("UTEP") provides that sponsors of non-industrial projects and projects whose terms deviate from the standard must secure the consent of local taxing jurisdictions in order to structure the terms of an Agency PILOT Agreement; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the Application, and in furtherance of the Project's positive financial impact within the Town and the County of St. Lawrence, the Company has requested the Town's support and consent in establishing a PILOT Agreement for the Project equivalent to the PILOT structure as outlined below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town hereby authorizes the Agency and the Company to enter into a PILOT Agreement whereby the schedule of PILOT payments is more particularly described in Schedule A, which is attached to the Certificate, as hereinafter defined.

Section 2. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to execute and deliver a consent certificate (the "Certificate"), in the form attached hereto, such Certificate to be delivered to the Agency as evidence of the Town's consent to enter into the within-described PILOT Agreement.
