The meeting was called to order at 6:02 pm by Supervisor Matthews

PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

- Morris Jeffries stated flags need to be replaced, that they are in bad shape. Supervisor Matthews said they will address the issue. He also questioned when the ballfield would be done. Supervisor Matthews explained that they needed to purchase the remaining supplies from another vender as the previous vender did not provide all that was purchased and that the storm had set back any work that was planned to be done. Councilor Kerr suggested to bid the work out. The board will assess what work needs to be done & materials needed.
- Shelley Grimshaw spoke about her committee planning a special Halloween weekend for October 25th, 26th & 27th. They are looking for permission to take a small group tour of the cemetery by the old school and will need roadways blocked off for about 15 minutes for a small parade on Sunday October 27th. Supervisor Matthews informed them they needed definite date and time so he can submit to the county for permission.
- Connie Bessette had questions on the town Celebrations Fund. The board informed her it is for flag replacement, flagpole replacement, decorations, replacement decorations, flowers, & budgeted town festivities. She stated she had asked a member of the Town for a \$25.00 sponsor/donation for the Enrichment Group, and she was told they would look into it and get back to her. She was then told it couldn't be done. She also questioned why the Enrichment Group had not received any of the Celebrations Funds for their activities. The council explained that the Celebrations Fund is budgeted the year before and that everything needs to be brought to the board, not one board member, to

decide on. She also questioned how many flowers were purchased and how much the town spent on them. There was a suggestion of purchasing hometown hero banners in place of flowers as they probably wouldn't be as much as the cost of the flowers and the upkeep of them.

Supervisor's Report August 20, 2024

1- Financial Report

-Details of all income and expense transactions have been filed with the town clerk. -Account balances as of August 20, 2024, for the general fund, highway fund, capital improvement fund, and street light fund have been filed with the town clerk.

I got Lowes payment processed for just the materials that they delivered. I checked with Pete to let him know that upon his free time he could use what's there. I am hoping to see this done before snowfall, although the weather has caused a delay, and other projects take precedent.

I am prepping to get the budget started, I'm waiting on our 2023 report. I have a call into Jon.

I would like to purpose an estimate on the Library Roof, as for the combination of the last two weather events have caused damage, we may be able to apply for a grant for the project in the coming year.

LEGISLATURE REPORT: Larry Denesha

 Would like to recognize all the Town Highway departments, County Highway departments, Fire departments, EMS departments, for all their help during the recent storm with the flooding. There were towns that weren't affected, or not as affected, by flooding helping other towns. Everyone pulled together.

- NYS Department of Financial Services help line available for Homeowners & Small Business number is 1-800-339-1759. There are \$50,000.00 grants.
- Passed a Resolution urging Governor Hochul to veto NYS Assembly bill A2882 & NYS Senate bill S6649. Imposes criminal liability for mandated signage. They are to impose signs that firearm dealers will need to display in their shops inside and out. If signs are not posted, they will be fined at least \$1,000.00 or 15 days in county jail.
- Passed a Resolution adopting the Workers Compensation Self Insurance portion for 2025, Town of Russell's for 2024 is \$28,251.00, in 2025 is going up to \$37,556.00, going up by \$9,305.00.
- Appointed a new Director of Public Health Erin Strife, started in August. She
 recently spoke about the Triple EEE virus (Eastern Equine Encephalitis), which
 we have had 5 horses infected within St Lawrence County. This virus can be
 passed to humans. Since 2011 in NYS there were 11 reported cases in which 9
 people had died and the other 2 had brain damage and never fully recovered.
 This virus is contracted from mosquitos. Soil & Water, by Coakleys in Canton,
 are giving away mosquito pucks for yards wherever you have standing water.
- County & State met the threshold for FEMA. We are eligible.

Highway Report

We have been busy with all the damage from the storm. We had over 45 locations with major damage to all our roads except the Town Line Road and Cassiddy Road. We had help from the Town of Waddington and the Town of Lisbon. I would like to give Mike Beldock and his men from Lisbon and Dave Putney and his crew from Waddington a huge thank you. Without their trucks and equipment, we would not have been able to open our roads as fast as we did. I would also like to thank J. E. Sheehan, Frank Mackin and Wayne French for staying open and providing gravel so we could get roads open. They worked late nights and Sunday to help us.

I have done an initial assessment for our damaged roads and bridges to submit to FEMA, \$612,475.00 to our roads and \$975,000.00 to our bridges that we own. The county owns all other bridges. The total initial estimate of all damages is \$1,587,475.00. I would also like to thank the Highway Crew for an impressive job during and after the storm. We still have a lot of work to do before winter, but I am confident our crew will get it done.
